## *BYLAWS OF THE

## KANSAS STATE UNIVERSITY SECTION

## AMERICAN CHEMICAL SOCIETY

Section 1. The name of the organization shall be "Kansas State University Section of the Name AMERICAN CHEMICAL SOCIETY", commonly called "Local Section".

Section 2. The purpose of the Local Section shall be to further the interests of chemistry. Organization Territory Members and

Section 3. The Local Section has been organized under the auspices and with the support of the national organization called the "AMERICAN CHEMICAL SOCIETY". The Constitution and Bylaws of the SOCIETY shall take priority at all times over the bylaws of the Local Section.

Section 4. The territory of the Local Section shall be that assigned by the SOCIETY. The

Section 5. The rolls of the Section shall include those MEMBERS, ASSOCIATE

Section 6. Individuals who are not members or National Affiliates of the SOCIETY may

Section 7. MEMBERS, ASSOCIATE MEMBERS, National Affiliates, and Local Section One phase of this shall be to hold public meetings which shall be addressed by lecturers in some field of chemistry or a closely related field of science involving chemistry. headquarters of the Local Section shall be at Manhattan, Kansas. MEMBERS, and National Affiliates of the SOCIETY residing within the territory of the Section, provided that exceptions to this rule may be made in conformity with the Constitution and Bylaws of the SOCIETY. affiliate with the Local Section and help bear the cost of its operation by paying dues of $\$ 2.00$ per year.

Affiliates shall have such rights and privileges as are accorded them by the Constitution and Bylaws of the SOCIETY. National Affiliates and Local Section Affiliates may not vote for or hold an elective position of the Section, vote on articles of incorporation and bylaws of the Section, or serve as voting

[^0]members of the Executive Committee.
Section 8. The officers of the Local Section shall be Chair, Chair-Elect, who will serve as Officers

Section 9. Officers shall regularly be elected by November 15. The candidates for the Election of Officers various offices shall be nominated by the Section members in the following manner:

> A list of the members of the Local Section eligible to hold office and a ballot will be sent to each Section member eligible to vote. Each such member may select one candidate for each office to be filled and return the ballot to the Executive Committee within 10 days. The Executive Committee will tabulate the ballots and the two highest, or three in case of a tie for second, will, with their consent, be presented to the Section as the nominees for the various offices. In case more than three nominees result from a tie for an office, the complete results of the balloting will be made known to the members of the Section and another ballot taken. The list of nominees for the various offices will then be distributed to each member eligible to vote. Ballots will be cast by mail and the results of this election will be made known at the meeting which next follows completion of the balloting and tallying of the ballots.

Section 10. The Executive Committee empowered to transact all business requiring prompt Executive
Committee attention for the Local Section shall be composed of the officers of the Local Section. When the office of Secretary-Treasurer is held by one individual he shall be entitled to one vote only. The Executive Committee shall arrange programs.

Section 11. The fiscal year of the Local Section shall be from January 1 to December 31.

## Fiscal Year

Section 12. The organization shall meet at the call of the Executive Committee. Meetings Meetings are normally to be held in lecture rooms provided by the Kansas State University. Notices of meetings shall be sent out to members and affiliates by the Secretary.

Section 13. The Treasurer's and Secretary's reports shall be examined yearly as soon after Examination January 1 as it is reasonable to have all bills received and paid. The examining of Secretary's committee shall be comprised of three-the latest former Chair in good \& Treasur- standing, the incoming Chair and the Chair-Elect. The Secretary's and er's Reports Treasurer's books shall be open to examination by any member of the Section at any time.

Section 14. The Local Section shall be financed by apportionment of funds by the Finances SOCIETY, dues of Local Section Affiliates and contributions.

Section 15. Financial and other reports shall be made to the SOCIETY when necessary to Reports to meet the requirements of the SOCIETY through its Constitution and Bylaws.

Section 16. Any item not covered by the bylaws may be written into the bylaws of the Changes in \& Local Section or any bylaw may be changed by a $2 / 3$ vote of the Local Section Additions to membership present at each of two meetings, provided that the second meeting Bylaws shall be at least 14 days but not more than 90 days after the first meeting. Bylaws and amendments shall become effective upon approval of the Council unless a later date is specified. On all questions of order not covered by the Constitution, "Robert's Rules of Order" shall be considered authoritative.

Section 17. Upon the dissolution of the Local Section, any assets of the Section remaining Dissolution thereafter shall be conveyed to such organization then existent, within or without the territory of the Local Section, dedicated to the perpetuation of objects similar to those of the AMERICAN CHEMICAL SOCIETY, or to the the AMERICAN CHEMICAL SOCIETY so long as whichever organization is selected by the governing body of the Local Section at the time of dissolution shall be exempt under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 as amended or under each such successor provision of the Code as may be in effect at the time of the Section's dissolution.
