- STEP 1 Open the Organizer Registration Form. Fill out the form to create your account and click submit.
- STEP 2 <u>Login to your GWB Account</u> with your email address and password. If you organized a breakfast in 2020 or 2021, your email and password is still valid. If you have forgotten your password, you can reset it.
- STEP 3 Add a New Event to your account "My Events" page. This is how you can add your event to the global map.
- STEP 4 Go the <u>GWB Global Map</u> to check that your event location and details are correct. You can always update your page with new information by logging back into your account.
- STEP 5 Check out the "Resources" for ready to use marketing materials and connect with other organizers using the "Directory" page.
- STEP 6 Begin planning your event for 14 Feb 2023!
