On Sunday morning, the whole committee meets for breakfast and 3.5 hours of whole committee business, with the meeting scheduled to conclude by 11:30 AM. Subcommittees meet virtually at least twice a year, and small working groups also meet virtually to work on projects between national meetings, as determined by the subcommittee chairs.
	Significant committee activity also occurs between meetings, generally facilitated by email. The committee has three subcommittees: Safety Education, Partnership and Emerging Issues as well as an associated Safety Advisory Panel (SAP) that is called upon to work on the committee projects, which require additional expertise. The SAP meets appually in Washington DC
