The keynote speaker will be Dr. Ralph Keeling, Professor of Geochemistry at the Scripps Institution of Oceanography in La Jolla, CA. His talk, "Let CO₂ Levels Do the Talking," focuses on the merit of framing the climate discussion around the buildup of CO₂ and its control. U.S. Chemistry Olympiad Team Wins Gold and Silver in France



The U.S. National Chemistry Olympiad program proudly announces the [great performance of the Alpha Mu Team at the 51st International Chemistry Olympiad competition](#), which concluded July 30, 2019, in Paris, France. Yajvan Ravan (Churchill High School, MI), Anton Ni (University High School, CA), and Edward Jin (Arnold O. Beckman High School, CA) earned gold medals, placing 19th, 28th, and 30th, respectively. Albert Liu (North Hollywood High School, CA) earned a silver medal, placing 59th. More than 300 students from 80 countries competed at this year's International Chemistry Olympiad.
